




Short biography

Martin Luther King
Jr. (born Michael King Jr., January
15, 1929 - April 4, 1968) was an
American Baptist minister and
activist who was a leader in the
Civil Rights Movement. He is best
known for his role in the
advancement of civil rights using
nonviolent civil disobedience based
on his Christian beliefs.









HIS LEADERSHIP

Who is Martin Luther King Jr.

Exceptional public speaker.

Born in Jan 15 1929.

American Baptist minister and activist.

Leader of African-American Civil Rights Movement.

Leader of Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC).

Leadership challenges faced by ML King Jr.

Arrested over 20 times for protesting.

His home was bombed and set afire.

Overwhelming criticism especially by antagonistic Whites and clergy his push for equity.

Police brutality and increasing poverty.

Prevailing negative attitude among people.

Strategies deployed by ML King Jr.

Nonviolent resistance following the principles of Jesus and Mahatma Gandhi.

Influential words and actions can change people's attitude and history.

Multi-race coalition for shared vision.






